1. Catalog Course Description:

This advanced composition course focuses on the development of substantive modern dance compositional works based on intent, form, and content relationships. It is typically offered during the last four weeks of Summer Term and taught by one guest artist/teacher for four weeks, or by two guest artist/teachers for two weeks each.
